Why Use ChatGPT Projects

Step-by-Step Setup

1. Open ChatGPT and click on the 'Projects' tab from your sidebar.
2. Click 'New Project' and name it based on your goal (e.g., '2024 Content Calendar').
3. Inside the Project, click 'New Textdoc' to create files for:
 - Research
 - Drafts
 - Outlines
 - Prompt libraries
4. Organize using folders like 'Blog Posts', 'Marketing', 'Client Assets', or 'SEO Tasks'.
5. Chat within the Project to maintain memory and keep your workflow connected.

What to Use Projects For

- Blog series with structured outlines and drafts
- Affiliate marketing campaigns with CTA tests and notes
- Automation planning and SOPs
- Client folders with ongoing deliverables and history
- Building a knowledge base or prompt reference library

Tips for Success

- Be specific with file names (e.g., 'Email Draft 1 – Welcome Sequence')
- Keep a running notes doc for ideas, links, and feedback
- Use one Project per goal or campaign to avoid clutter
- Create a 'Prompt Vault' to reuse high-performing prompts
- Review and archive old documents weekly to keep things tidy
